SCHOOL YEAR 2009-2010

Starting Date

In School District 11, school bells ring for the first day of the 2009-10 school year on Tuesday, August 18, 2009.

Elementary school pupils, including kindergartners who pre-registered in the spring, report at their school's regular starting time on Tuesday, August 18, 2009. Start times vary from building to building within the district because of bus routes, etc. August 18 will be a full school day, and lunch will be served. Kindergarten and elementary pupils new to District 11 or transferring from another school within District 11 may register at the school they will attend when schools open for regular business on Monday, August 3, 2009.

Age Requirements

Children must be five years of age on or before October 1 to enroll in kindergarten and six years of age by the same date to enroll in grade one unless previous public school kindergarten attendance can be verified. If a student is transferring from a parochial, private or other public school at the kindergarten or first-grade level and does not meet the District 11 entrance age requirements, it is recommended that the principal, teacher and a supervisor screen the student as an exception and make a decision at the building level, using any of the support services recommended. If testing is used in any of these cases, no charge will be made to parents.

Peterson Air Force Base

All Peterson Air Force Base students in grades K-5 will attend McAuliffe Elementary, 830 Hathaway Drive. Students in grades 6-8 will attend Jack Swigert Aerospace Academy, 4220 East Pikes Peak Avenue. Students who attended during 2008-2009 in grades 6 & 7 are grandfathered to attend Russell Middle School, 3825 E. Montebello Drive. Students in grades 9-12 attend Mitchell High School, 1205 Potter Drive. Students may be registered at the schools, which will be open for regular business on Monday, August 3, 2009.

Summer Registration

Summer registration for elementary and middle school students is offered July 1 through July 31, 2009 (closed July 3), from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., at 1033 North Franklin Street (main door at west side of building). High school students must register at their appropriate high school office during regular school office hours.

Enrollment Information

All pupils enrolling in a District 11 school for the first time will be required to submit birth certificates, up-to-date immunization records and proof of residence at the time of enrollment.

Secondary students should bring their latest report card when meeting with counselors for scheduling of classes. Elementary pupils who attended schools in other districts last year should submit their last report card from the school they last attended. The report card will be returned to the student after it has been reviewed.

Students transferring from one middle or senior high school to another are requested to call the school they will attend and arrange to register. Failure to do so may delay enrollment. The schools will be open for regular business on Monday, August 3, 2009.

Required Immunizations June 5, 2009

The School Immunization Law **requires that all students enrolling in a District 11 school for the first time present an immunization record.** If the shot record is not up to date, the student has 14 days to get the required immunizations. In addition, if more than one set of shots is needed, the parent must also sign an immunization plan in order for the student to attend school. The following are the immunization requirements as per the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

As of the start of the 2009-2010 school year, Colorado state law requires that students entering sixth grade, seventh grade, eighth grade, 10th grade, 11th grade, or 12th grade in August 2009 must have a Tdap (tetanus// diphtheria/ acellular pertussis) immunization. (This new requirement was just implemented last school year). ALSO, kindergarten, first and

second grade students are now required to have two Varicella immunizations or have a history of the disease confirmed, in writing, by a health care provider or school nurse.

Parents may sign an exemption based on religious, medical or personal reasons.

School Meal Programs

Cafeteria services for schools with school meal programs will begin on the first regularly scheduled full day of classes – Tuesday, August 18, 2009. Roosevelt-Edison Charter School, Globe Charter School, and Star Academy meal programs will begin when their 2009-2010 school year resumes. The cost of a full hot lunch, including milk, is \$1.95 for elementary school, \$2.10 for middle school and \$2.35 for high school students. A la carte service is also available at all middle and high schools. Adult lunches (for staff and visitors), including beverages, will be \$2.75 in elementary and middle schools and \$3.00 in high schools. White milk will cost \$.55, and flavored milk will cost \$.60. Breakfast programs are available at some school sites for \$1.10 for elementary schools and \$1.20 for middle schools and high schools. Adult breakfasts (for staff and visitors) in elementary and secondary schools will be \$1.50. Reduced-price full lunches (for students who qualify) will be free to children in grades PK-2 and will remain at \$.40 for students in grades 3-12. Breakfast will be free for students K-12 who qualify for “reduced price.”

For students who were enrolled in the district database and who qualified for meal benefits on the last day of school last school year (2008-09), all free and reduced price meals will continue for up to 30 school days in the new school year or until a new form has been completed and approved or denied. Households are required by USDA federal guidelines to fill out new meal benefits applications each school year. Free and reduced price meal applications will be mailed to households in the district the first part of August. Applications will also be available in school offices. Only one application per household should be turned in at the school office. All students who are not classified as “free” or “reduced” from the prior year are “full pay” until determination on free or reduced meals has been made. Parents are responsible for providing lunches from home or lunch money during this time.

Families are encouraged to pre-pay for student meals. Pre-payment may be made at the school, at www.d11.org/fns/prepay.htm, or by phone at 1-866-896-7594, where a credit card or check may be used.

Buses

Bus service for all schools eligible for district-furnished transportation will begin on Tuesday, August 18, 2009, unless requested otherwise by an individual school. Parents of students eligible for district-provided transportation services will be notified by postcard during the week of August 3-7, 2009. Bus route, stop locations and times will be provided on the postcard. In addition, one can access school and busing information on the D-11 Web site at <http://www.d11.org>. Finally, one may contact the Transportation Department, 520-2940, or the school office when the schools open for regular business on August 3, 2009, to obtain information on bus schedules.

Orientation Programs

If middle school/high school students do not receive a newsletter or other notification with a schedule of times and places for orientation activities, they should contact the school office when the schools open for regular business on August 3, 2009.

Athletic Fees

The District 11 Board of Education has established a \$65 participation fee for all athletes at the high school level and a \$40 participation fee for middle school athletes. For high school students qualifying for reduced lunch, the fee is \$30; and for those qualifying for free lunch, \$22. For middle school athletes who participate in the reduced lunch program, the athletic participation fee is \$20; for middle school athletes who participate in the free lunch program, the fee is \$15. All fees will be collected by the business office at each school. Students wishing to try out for or participate in a sport must show a paid receipt and have a current physical on file. No athletic equipment will be issued without a receipt.
