The **Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS)** are a series of standardized assessments designed to measure Colorado students' mastery of the Colorado academic content standards.

- The English Language Arts and Math assessments (PARCC) are administered in the spring to students in grades 3-9. The tests consist of six 40-90 minute units and measure critical thinking and problem solving skills that are important in college and the workforce. The PARCC tests evaluate student progress and show teachers and parents where a student needs help through personalized instruction that meets individual student needs. Colorado mandated in compliance with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Time: 8 9.5 hours over several days
- The Colorado developed **Science** test is given in the spring to all students in 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and one grade in high school. The test consists of three 60 minute units. Colorado mandated. Compliance with ESSA. Time: 3 hours
- The Colorado developed **Social Studies** test is given in the spring to a sample of students in grades 4 and 7. Approximately one third of students in these grades will take the test each year. The test consists of three 60 minute units. Colorado mandated. Time: 3 hours
- The Colorado Alternative (CoAlt) tests are given at the same time as the other CMAS testing. The CoAlt assessment is designed for students with significant cognitive disabilities for whom the general education assessments, even with accommodations, are not appropriate. Students must meet the Participation Guidelines to participate in this academic assessment. There are alternate tests for all four tested subjects (Science, Social Studies, English Language Arts, and Math). Alternative tests are Colorado mandated. Compliance with ESSA.
  - For the alternate English Language Arts and Math assessments, Colorado is a member of the Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) alternate assessment consortium. DLM is a computer-delivered alternate assessment given to all students who qualify in grades 3-9. Time: 70 minutes per subject area.
  - Colorado has developed an alternate assessment for the science and social studies tests. These tests are paper only for students with significant cognitive disabilities. Alternate social studies tests are given to 1/3 of Colorado Students who qualify in grades 4, 7, and one grade in high school. Alternate science tests are given to all students who qualify in grades 5, 8, and one grade in high school. Time: 1 hour per subject area.

**NAEP (National Assessment of Educational Progress)** assessments measure a small sample of 4th and 8th grade student performance in Math or Reading at selected schools in the district. One middle school will additionally administer Writing, Civics, U.S. History and Geography. The assessment charts educational progress nationwide. Colorado mandated. Compliance with ESSA. Time: 120 minutes

Access for ELLs (English Language Learners) is a computer based online assessment that monitors student progress in acquiring academic English in the domains of speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Colorado mandated. Compliance with ESSA. Time: 2 hours

**PSAT 10** is designed to measure the skills and knowledge that current research shows are essential for college and career readiness and success and serves as a check-in on student progress to help pinpoint areas for development. Educational Testing Service (ETS) administers the PSAT 10 for the College Board. The test is state mandated for tenth grade students. 4 hours.

**SAT** is designed to measure the skills and knowledge that current research shows are essential for college and career readiness and success. The SAT is a nationally recognized measure of academic readiness and is accepted by most colleges in the United States for admission requirements. The test is state mandated for eleventh grade students. - 4 hours

**DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills)** assesses the early literacy and reading skills of students in kindergarten through sixth grade. DIBELS identifies students with reading difficulties, targets specific instructional support and monitors student progress. Colorado mandated. Compliance with the READ Act. Time: Up to 5 hours per school year

**TS** (**Teaching Strategies**) **Gold for Kindergarteners** is a series of 52 teacher observations that are entered online. These help evaluate a kindergartener's readiness for school. Colorado Mandated. Time: (not applicable; observations made by teacher)

**Galileo K-12** is an assessment of student English Language Arts (ELA), Math and Science skills in grades kindergarten through twelfth grade. The results show if the student is mastering the Colorado academic content standards. School level testing in

ELA and Math is required for grades 1-9. Kindergarten and grades 10 through 12 may also test at school discretion. Schools may also test Science. Time: Up to 6 hours per school year

**Achieve3000** is a 5-Step Literacy Routine that is designed to build the skills for close reading of informational text with the explicit purpose of finding the evidence necessary to respond to a written prompt. Optional school level testing. Time: 40 minutes

**CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test)** is an aptitude test that measures a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade student's general and specific cognitive abilities. It measures learned verbal, quantitative, and nonverbal reasoning and problem-solving skills. District mandated. Time: 2.5 hours
