Community:

Located in the heart of Colorado Springs, Colorado at the Roy J. Wasson Academic Campus, Odyssey Early College and Career Options is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling over 200 full-times students and 300 part-time students. The school opened in the fall of 2013 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2014.

Odyssey Early College and Career Options is a “school of choice” *and* a satellite campus for Pikes Peak Community College (PPCC). Our students have the opportunity to earn an Associate’s degree or 60 credit hours towards their Bachelor’s degree—at no cost to our families! Our curriculum is designed as a coherent unit, with high school and college-level work blended into a single academic program.

We offer two types of Associate’s degrees. Our four-year university bound students take guaranteed to transfer/dual credit classes towards an Associate of Arts or Science degree, while our career and technical bound students earn articulated credit towards an Associate of General Arts degree.

In addition to partnering with PPCC, our Career Pathways teachers also partner with the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (UCCS), Metro State University of Denver (MSU), and the University of Colorado at Denver (UCD).

From our “college for high school credit” courses to our exciting Career Pathways in Automotive, Business & Marketing, Cyber Security, Education, Graphic Arts & Communications, Journalism, Hotel & Restaurant Management, and Horticulture & Landscape Technologies, students enjoy a rigorous and relevant education, with highly qualified adjunct faculty members who are excited to grow students to be their best selves.

Colorado Springs is home to the United States Air Force Academy, Colorado College (CC), the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (UCCS), Pikes Peak Community College (PPCC) and the Olympic Training Center.

Curriculum:

Odyssey Early College and Career Options educates students grades nine through twelve, with an accreditation through the Colorado Department of Education. Odyssey is home to several award-winning Academic, Career & Technical, and Vocational programs including ACE, AVID, Cyber Patriot, FBLA, FCCLA, FHA, ProStart, and Skills USA. In addition, Career Pathways is the 2014 recipient of the Pikes Peak Work Force Center’s *Pathways to Prosperity Award*. The school is a member of the College Board, the Colorado School Counselor Association, the Colorado Council on High School/College Relations, Association of Career and Technical Education, and Colorado Association of Career and Technical Education.

The academic program is comprised of a total of eight 90-minute block classes. Students may attend four regular classes daily and one Career Pathways block class, or they may attend eight regular classes. Block classes are semester-long; block classes meet Tuesday through Friday and alternate classes every other Monday.

Honors classes are offered in English 092, Algebra 1/2, Algebra 3/4, Biology 1&2, US Multicultural History 1/2, and Consumer Economics. Entry into MAT 120 requires a Next Generation Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics score of 240 or higher & MAT 121 requires Next Generation Advanced Algebra and Functions score of 245 or higher. Entry into ENG 121 requires a Next Generation Writing ACCUPLACER score of 255 or higher.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation:

GPA is computer using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 46 credits is **required for graduation. College classes are weighted by one point.** Transcripts are updated with current grades in January and May.
