What is the Adopt-A-Book Program?

This year our fantastic library staff in collaboration with the Stratton PTA are offering an exciting new book program. Does your child have a favorite book that they love to read? One that they want to be associated with during their time at Stratton? For just \$10.00, your child, children, or family can adopt a book in the Stratton Library. A commemorative placard will be placed in the front interior of all Adopted Books, highlighting the fact that this book was adopted in honor of your child. The Adopted Books will become a permanent part of our school's library and a lasting record of your children's years at Stratton Elementary School. Future generations will enjoy them for many years to come!

What are your Adopt-A-Book Funds Helping with?

Accelerated Reader (AR) is software for K-12 schools for monitoring the practice of reading and has been utilized by Stratton students and teachers for many years. The product is intended to help children at school manage their reading, to provide teachers with an assessment of the reading ability of a class, and to encourage reading.

This year there was not enough money in the school budget to cover the entire cost of the software for the year. Because of the value of this program, we wanted to come up with a solution to ensure we can cover the cost for the school to be able to continue to utilize this great resource! Adopt-A-Book is an opportunity for our school community to do just that!

How do I adopt a book?

During the week of February 10th through 14th, pick up a book adoption form located outside the front office, fill it out, pay the fee, and the library staff will place the Commemorative Placard in your child's favorite book. The fee can be paid in the form of cash or a check written to Stratton Elementary PTA. All proceeds from this program will go directly to the payment of the AR software.
