Common Language/Definitions



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Asynchronous Learning: Asynchronous learning happens on the student's schedule. While the instructor or will provide materials for reading, lectures for viewing, assignments for completing, and exams for evaluation, the student has the ability to access and satisfy these requirements within a flexible time frame. Methods of asynchronous online learning include self-guided lesson modules, streaming video content, virtual libraries, posted lecture notes, and exchanges across discussion boards or social media platforms.

Synchronous Learning: Synchronous learning is the kind of learning that happens in real time. This means that the student, classmates, and instructor interact in a specific virtual place, through a specific online medium, at a specific time. In other words, it's not exactly anywhere, anyhow, anytime. Methods of synchronous online learning include video conferencing, teleconferencing, live chatting, and live-streaming lectures.

Office Hours: time when a student or small group of students can drop in and get help from a teacher on any recent subject matter, to include tutoring and/or answering clarifying questions for students.
