National Honor Society for Dance Arts



NHS for Dance Arts is a program of the National Dance Education Organization created to recognize outstanding artistic merit, leadership, and academic achievement in students studying the dance arts. Kemper Dance Academy is a local dance studio which partners with NHSDA to honor students' commitments and

achievements in the dance arts, as well as help advance the field of dance education. Three main requirements for induction into NHSDA including a minimum number of chapter activity participation points, character evaluation by the chapter sponsor, and a minimum grade point average of 3.0. **Kayla Suyatana**, Grade 11, was inducted into the Kemper Dance Academy Chapter of the NHS for Dance Arts on December 13, 2020, and we celebrated her this year.

Team Boss & Sachs Foundation Scholarship



Class of 2021 Coronado High School graduate **William White IV** was the recipient of a \$30,000 grant from **Team Boss**, a Springs-based track team, and the **Sachs Foundation**, an educational foundation providing opportunities to Black and African Americans in Colorado who meet

academic and financial criteria. Team Boss is a group of more than a dozen professional runners, four of whom competed in the Tokyo Olympic Games. The Sachs Foundation, founded in 1931 by Pikes Peak area resident Henry Sachs, has sent more than 5,000 students to college since its incorporation.

Team Boss and Sachs Foundation partnered to create a running race to raise fund for scholarships and social justice. William was a perfect candidate for the mission of these 2 powerhouses: a National Honor Society member and high school captain of Coronado's track, basketball, and tennis teams. William plans to attend Vanderbilt University.
