Grade point averages (GPA) for students graduating in 2021 and thereafter are computed on the basis of a 4.0 grade point scale. Honors, AP and PS Courses receive additional weight. Grade points are awarded as follows:

A = 4 Grade Points

- Courses designated H (honors) = 4.5 points
- AP (advanced placement), PS (postsecondary) = 5 points

B = 3 Grade Points

- Courses designated H (honors) = 3.5 points
- AP (advanced placement), PS (postsecondary) = 4 points

C = 2 Grade Points

- Courses designated H (honors) = 1.5
- AP (advanced placement), PS (post-secondary) = 3 points

D = 1 Grade Point

- Courses designated H (honors) = 2.5
- AP (advanced placement), PS (post-secondary) = 2 points

F = 0 Grade Points
