

Whereas: July 4th remains a national holiday and a day to celebrate our independence, our freedoms, our rights, and our responsibilities as United States citizens; and


Whereas: Our Nation remains dedicated to the foundation and the principles of the Declaration of Independence, deriving its just powers from the consent of the governed;


