About Our School

Doherty High School is a four-year comprehensive high school with a current enrollment of 1900 students. It serves the northeast area of School District 11, the 2nd largest school district in Colorado Springs. Approximately 42% of the students qualify for the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch program. The student body reflects the ethnic mix of the city's population with an enrollment of 53% Caucasian; 29% Hispanic; 7% African American; 2% Asian; and 9% Other.

Academic Program Details

Doherty's core curriculum is aligned with the CollegeBoard and uses the Pre-AP curriculum in Biology, Algebra, World History, and English. We are also an AP Capstone school offering both AP Seminar & AP Research. Additionally, we offer over 40 rigorous AP and Honors classes in which students can earn college credit.

Honors

There are 18 honors courses offered in all academic departments but vary with grade level. Enrollment in honors courses is by teacher recommendation and/or self-selection.

Advanced Placement (AP)

In May 2022, 564 AP exams were taken by 359 Students; 37% of the scores were a 3 or better. Enrollment in AP courses is by teacher recommendation and/or by self-selection. AP coursed offered include:

There are many additional academic choices for students such as participating in concurrent enrollment through the UC- Colorado Springs, CSU -Pueblo, or Pikes Peak Community College. A Career Start Program with Pikes Peak Community College is also available in specific vocational fields.

Graduation Requirements

46 total credits are required for graduation. One credit is earned each semester per class.

- **6 credits of Social Studies** (including 2 U.S. History and 1 credit of U.S. Government)
- **6 credits of Science**
- **3 credits of Physical Education**
- **2 credits of Humanities** (Art, Music or Foreign Language)

- **1 credit of Career Readiness**
- **1 credit of Health**
- **1 credit of Economics**
- **1 credit of Computer Science**

The Cumulative grade point average and class rank are based on weighted grades. AP classes are awarded 1.0 points and honors classes are awarded 0.5 points. Classes with an earned grade of an A through F are included in the GPA. Students who repeat a course receive a single credit and the higher grade is used in the calculation of the GPA.
