Course Name: Child & Adolescent Development

Course Number: CF.PARENT

Course Length: Two (2) Semesters

Grade: 9-12

Prerequisite: none

Credits per Semester: One (1) Practical Arts or Elective

Credits per Semester: One (1) Practical Arts, Elective or *Health

Course Description: This class is designed to help students become effective future parents. Students will understand the responsibilities of parenthood and practice techniques for nurturing productive, caring children. Through a variety of classroom activities including discussions, individual and group interaction projects, guest speakers, and visual aids, students will learn skills for caring for children as well as the importance of self-care and caring for the community.

Course Description: This class is designed to help students become effective future parents. Students will understand the responsibilities of parenthood and practice techniques for nurturing productive, caring children. Through a variety of classroom activities including discussions, individual and group interaction projects, guest speakers, and visual aids, students will learn skills for caring for children as well as the importance of self-care and caring for the community. *Upon completion of Child & Adolescent Development AND Relationships, students are eligible to receive one district Health credit to replace either Practical Arts (PWR 2021+) or Elective. This will be done manually by registrars on the recommendation of the instructor.

Course Name: PLTW Principles of Biomedical Sciences 1H, 2H

Course Number: PLTW.PBI1H, PLTW.PBI2H

Course Length: One (1) Semester each

Grade: 9-12

Prerequisite: none

Credits per Semester: One (1) SCIENCE

Credits per Semester: One (1) Biology

Course Description: Not listed

Course Description: PLTW Biomedical Science students are empowered to explore and find solutions to some of today's most pressing medical challenges. Through scaffolded activities that connect learning to life, students step into the roles of biomedical science professionals and investigate topics including human medicine, physiology, genetics, microbiology, cell structure and function, and public health. Students study the ecological interaction among organism by investigating viral and bacterial immunology and evolution. Students will understand key biological concepts to meet state and district standards. Students work together in teams to find unique solutions, and in the process, learn in-demand, transferable skills like critical thinking and communication.

Reason for Change: Modify subject credit to biology. Already receives science credit. Review of the National Health Science and Next Generation Standards, PBS covers all equivalency. Evolution included.

Course Name: Relationships
Course Number: CF.RELA
Course Length: Two (2) Semesters
Grade: 10-12
Prerequisite: none
Credits per Semester: One (1) Practical Arts or Elective

Credits per Semester: One (1) Practical Arts, Elective or *Health

Course Description: The purpose of this course is to acquire academic knowledge and understanding necessary for healthy, respectful and caring relationships across the life span. Students integrate knowledge, skills and practices required by individuals and families to develop, manage, and strengthen: intrapersonal relationships; interpersonal relationships; adult relationships; and family relationships. The focus is on the development for the individual as an adult family leader. Emphasis is placed on family dynamics, effective communication and healthy interpersonal relationships.

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Reason for Change: Upon completion of sequence of courses outlined in new course description, the Health credit may be applied to the subject code for Relationships. Upon review of the FACS standards for each course, the crosswalk reveals nearly 100% match of standards. Modified to meet 100%.

Course Name: Stagecraft 1-2
Course Number: EN.STAGE1, EN.STAGE2
Course Length: Two (2) Semesters each
Grade: 9-12
Prerequisite: none
Credits per Semester: One (1) Humanities or Elective

Credits per Semester: One (1) Humanities, Practical Arts, Elective or Postsecondary Workforce Readiness (2021+)

Course Description: This is primarily a hands-on lab course in backstage work. Students will learn basic stage tools and facilities. They will be involved in maintaining the stage and working on theatre productions. Areas covered will be scenery construction, lighting, make-up, costuming, rigging, and general stage operation.

Reason for Change: Modify subject credit to include practical arts and postsecondary workforce readiness for class of 2021+. Developmental plans for CTE to include extension of programming in Theater and Technical Theater.
