Title I: 101

- Title I is a federal formula grant
 - School districts get Title I funds based on the number of students receiving free or reduced lunch
 - As of October 1, 2019:
 - D11 has 24,886 students
 - 14,431 receive free or reduced lunch
 - The poverty index for the district is 58.0%

How Do Schools Get To Be Title I?

- The Federal Government says schools must be funded in rank order by percentage of poverty
- District 11 funds schools based on FREE only – 60% or higher for secondary and 59% for elementary schools. D11 is serving 20 schools in 20-21.

How are Title I funds used?

- To increase reading and math achievement
 - Hiring additional teachers and aides
 - Paying for tutoring for students who need extra support
 - Materials and supplies for above
 - Staff Development opportunities for teachers

Title I Program Types

- In a Schoolwide program, all students in the building are eligible for services.
- In a Targeted Assistance program, students are assessed and given extra learning opportunities based on individual student need.
