

ARTICULATION

In accordance with Board Policy IHCDA, Postsecondary Enrollment, and this regulation, the District may pay for career and technical articulation and certifications when such opportunities are made available through certified District programs and align to a student's postsecondary workforce readiness as identified in their Academic Plan of Study

Articulation is a program by which students earn college credit for the Career and Technical Education (CTE) course work. Articulation agreements are determined annually through a process with our postsecondary partner, Pikes Peak Community College.

Articulation agreements are not limited to Pikes Peak Community College.

QUALIFICATIONS

Students may earn articulated credit if they receive an A or a B in a CTE course that has been articulated with a postsecondary course.

Students must seek articulated credit through a process of registering their articulated CTE courses at the postsecondary institution. They must demonstrate successful completion of the course with the minimum grades. They may do this by completing the articulation credit request (see IHCDA-E-3).

A student may receive credit up to three years after the completion of a course by submitting the appropriate documentation to Pikes Peak Community College.

A maximum of 6 credits may be articulated before the student is required to take a course at PPCC for a minimum of .5 credits. This course requirement may be fulfilled through Concurrent Enrollment while the student is enrolled in Colorado Springs School District 11 (the District).

COST

The cost of an articulated credit is \$10. The District may pay this cost. At Pikes Peak Community College, the cost of articulation, per student, is not to exceed \$40 per semester.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

New articulations agreements may be made possible at any time throughout the school year. Eligible CTE programs, CTE instructors, the CTE Director, and Pikes Peak Community College shall work collaboratively to pursue new articulations regularly.

The CTE Director and the CTE instructors shall maintain existing articulations as long as the courses and programs continue to be approved by the state CTE directors.
